ARE YOU READY FOR THE HOCKEY SEASON?

September is almost upon us - have you arranged your child's hockey for the upcoming season?

Our "A" teams hit the ice on September 20th and Saturday, September 26th is the start of games for house league players. If you have not yet enrolled your child with your Area Association, please do so NOW! Your child must be registered online in order to participate in evaluations, which take place in early September (see your Area Association website for dates and times). By enrolling late, you may have missed out on spots where spaces are limited not to mention that it is difficult for associations to plan coaches, uniforms and practice ice without clear indication of their enrollment numbers. MHL hockey registration opened May 1st – please make it a priority to register for your local hockey program.

Minor Novice Orientation Day September 26



On the MHL opening day for House League hockey, Saturday, September 26th, the Minor Novice teams will be participating in a special event to introduce them to their first year of league hockey.

The event will be held at **Meadowvale Four** Rinks Arena between 12:30 and 6:15 p.m.

All teams will participate in games (White/Red/ Gold level) or practices (Green/Blue) with postgame refreshments. Parents will have the opportunity to speak with MHL Directors who will be on-hand to distribute information about the league and to answer any questions.

CONVENING

The purpose of the MHL convening period is to review all players and teams in each House League division and age category with a view to **ensuring the best** possible scenarios for fair playing levels between teams.

Convening will occur from Sept. 26 to November 8 for the 2015/16 hockey season and will involve all House League players.

Each age division is handled by a separate committee comprised of an MHL Director as Committee Chair and a representative from each Area Association. The committee will determine movement of teams or players up or down within their respective skill categories. The goal is to provide a fair and balanced schedule for each division.

Should you have any questions during convening about the process, you should contact your Area Association division representative or Area Association Head Convenor. Contact information should be available on your Association website.

MHL REFERRAL PROGRAM

Did you know that **you could earn a \$50 credit** toward your registration fee at your association, by referring a brand new player to the Mississauga Hockey League. Eligible players must be a new player ages Tyke to Bantam, not a family member or resident with an existing registered player/family, must be a Mississauga resident and must never have been registered with the MHL before. Referee's Corner



Your MHL Officials will be ready for the start of the 2015-2016 season.

Every season under the auspices of Hockey Canada and the Ontario Hockey Federation, all officials must certify or re-certify by taking a Hockey Canada Referee Certification clinic. Each clinic is approximately 8 hrs in length and all officials must complete a nationwide examination to maintain their current level.

In the MHL, we will have approximately 140 officials. Most of them also officiating in other Leagues such as the GTHL, OHA, OMHA, OWHA, Alliance. The MHL will be hosting certification clinics in September to prepare for the start of the MHL season on Sun Sept 20. In addition, referee supervisors conduct on-ice clinics with the "A" level teams to provide guidelines on Head Contact, Checking from Behind, Communication and Shared Respect. These clinics have an added benefit for our Supervisors to get to know players and coaching staffs as they head into the new hockey season.

On behalf of the MHL Officiating Department, I would like to wish the coaches, players and parents a fun and safe 2015-2016 hockey season.

MHL Discipline Emphasis

The Discpline Committee was formed to support the rules emphasis policy of Hockey Canada with a goal of reducing aggressive play that can lead to the incidence of concussions and other injuries.

A second purpose is to emphasise the importance of respect in sport and to stop physical or verbal abuse of players, coaches and officials.

The ultimate goal is to keep our children playing hockey, not sitting on the sideline with a suspension or injury.

Over the past 5 years, *the number of suspensions received has dropped from just under 1600 per season to under 700.* Although it is difficult to show statistically, we know that the number of injuries is down significantly.

Considering that the average suspension is 2 to 3 games, our children are *sitting out 2000 to 3000 fewer games* than before.

To reinforce the program, referee supervisors also meet with each "A" Team that plays checking hockey to review the rules and how they will enforce/interpret them. These clinics lead to increased positive dialogue between the coach, players and the game officials resulting in improved respect and safety.

Building on the past success it was felt that one way to improve the system was to simplify it.

Players or coaches are required to appear before the MHL Discipline Emphasis committee if:

- 1. If they receive ONE Match Penalty or
- 2. If they receive TWO Gross Misconduct penalties in a season or
- 3. If they receive THREE Aggressive play suspensions in a season.

Teams that show a higher than normal aggressive play penalty history are required to take a Discipline Emphasis training program which is an on ice session with an MHL Referee Supervisor. Its purpose is to educate players and coaches in the application of rules related to Checking from Behind and Head Contact and to promote player safety.
